## Current Family Profile: Max



**Max Schuetz** is a 7 year old who has been living at Brent's Place since July. He and his mom, **Bobbie** moved in when he relapsed and needed a "Safe-Clean" place to stay. At the time of this interview, Max was in the hospital receiving his bone marrow transplant (BMT), after which he will stay at Brent's Place again for another 100 days.

We sat down with Bobbie to discuss their experience so far.

### ***What brought you to Brent's Place?***

Jane Ambro, a social worker at The Children's Hospital, suggested Brent's Place because Max relapsed with Leukemia and needed more treatment. We were hoping to go to BMT and needed a place to stay that was close because we live really far away. We didn't have any other options.

### ***How has your child's treatment affected your life?***

It has completely taken over our lives, treatment is our life now. I had to drop out of school and quit work and Max had to leave school and quit his normal life. We had to leave our life in Ridgeway to be here. Max has liked seeing the museums and sporting events but we are not city people.

### ***What is the best part of staying at Brent's Place?***

Staff is the best part with all the support and care they provide. Just knowing that your kid is in a safe environment is so important. Everyone at Brent's Place is looking out for each other and being careful.

### ***What is Max's favorite thing to do?***

Max loves to go to the aquarium, play combat and dueling with swords.

### ***What are you and Max most looking forward to when you get to go home?***

We can't wait to be with the people we love and be with our animals. Ridgeway is where our key sources of support are and we really want to get back. Max can't wait to go back to school. He loves to play with his friends and really wants to get back to that. We are also looking forward to the freedom from fear.

### ***What do you miss most?***

We miss friends and dogs, camping, skiing, hiking and swimming. Max misses the whole town of Ridgeway the most.

### ***Any other comments?***

We are so grateful that we have been able to have a safe home away from home that is clean and supportive, and still remembers that kids are kids. It is also great knowing that everyone understands when you don't feel like being social or can't be social because of sickness.

## Past Family Profile: Samuel



**Samuel Dunbar** is a 5 year old boy who stayed at Brent's Place in 2007 and 2008. He lives in Albuquerque, NM with his mom **Kelly** and dad **Will** and his sister **Casey**. He was diagnosed with NEMO, a disease that affects the immune system, and the only cure is a bone marrow transplant. Here is what Kelly had to say about how Sam and their family are doing now.

### *How is Samuel doing?*

Samuel is doing great. He had his central lines removed a little over a year after transplant, and just prior to that surgery, we found out he was cured from NEMO. For 3 years, Sam was isolated from extended family, other children, large crowds and from people who were sick, in fear that he wouldn't be able to fight off a simple illness. Today, we get to treat him like a regular kid, and next fall he will start Kindergarten. He is full of love, life and laughter!

### *How did Brent's Place help your family?*

Brent's Place was instrumental in Samuel's recovery. It was never an option for us to split up our family, especially because we were out of state, so living in a home-like apartment was a huge blessing to us. We became great friends with other families, sharing in their happiness and grieving with them during a loss; the support staff was always available when we needed a shoulder to cry on; there were plenty of activities for our daughter, Casey, who was having a hard time balancing the "sick" part of Samuel's transplant with the "healthy" part of being, well, healthy! There were always plenty of meals, which were especially appreciated after a long day in the hospital or clinic. Brent's Place made our home away from home as normal as it could possibly be, during the scariest time of our lives. Brent's Place not only helped our immediate family, they made it a home away from home to our extended family, as well.

### *How has life been post-Brent's Place?*

When we were discharged from the hospital to Brent's Place, there was an adjustment period for all of us. There was more freedom for Samuel and Casey, but a little more responsibility for Will and me. When we were discharged from Brent's Place, it would be one of the most bittersweet moments in our lives. We were leaving a place that we had grown to love, and had become exceptionally close to. We were so blessed to be leaving with our son, and we knew other families wouldn't be—that was very hard for us.

### *What's your favorite memory of Brent's Place?*

Hands down, our absolute favorite place was in the basement apartment of the old Brent's Place. Samuel's transplant was in the winter, and that apartment, together with our Christmas lights, radiant heat and general coziness was very comforting. The very first day we checked into Brent's Place, it was late in the afternoon and all the staff were gone for the day. My mom and I were reading about movies and books we could check out, so we made our way over to the Foundation House. A door was open, so we went in and promptly set off the alarm. We got to call Adele, and explain our situation. The next morning, we got a call from the staff, asking us to please move our car, as we were parked in Adele's spot. We were a little green! We love Adele, and I hope this makes her laugh! The busiest fire station in Denver was next to the old Brent's Place, and Sam would wake us up at 2:00am, or 4:00am, or whatever time the sirens were blaring, just to let us know the trucks were on their way to help someone. He loved the fire trucks. On the day of our discharge from Brent's Place, Krista arranged for the firemen to visit the residents. As we were packing up our car, we heard the scream of the sirens and saw all the lights. They closed off the street in front of Brent's Place and made quite a sight! Sam got to sit in the truck, spray the hose, start the sirens and turn on the lights—he was in heaven, as were many of our friends. It was quite the sendoff, and is forever etched in our minds! There are many other memories of Brent's Place, but the families have to top our list. It's not the usual way to meet and make friends, but we are hoping these friendships last forever. We met some really wonderful and amazing people!

### *Are you still involved with Brent's Place?*

Will and I love running, so when we found out that one of the fundraisers for Brent's Place was a 5k run, we were excited to participate. The first year we ran Kid's Cure, we entered six people. The word spread throughout our family, and the 2nd year we ran Kid's Cure, we entered about 16 people. Again, word traveled, and this past year we traveled with about 30 of our family members and friends to Denver. Last year, we put on a race in Albuquerque to benefit Brent's Place. There was a great article in the paper, and again, word spread. We had people come by the morning of the race just to make donations. There are many, many good people in this world!



# Our Volunteers . . .

## Volunteer Profile: Christopher Starks

When Chris is not volunteering at Brent's Place, he is working as the Senior Loan Officer and partner at First Class Financial Services. Chris also enjoys triathlons, hiking in the mountains, running and volleyball.

### *How did you find Brent's Place?*

I discovered Brent's Place online over eleven years ago. I met the great staff at Brent's Place and discussed volunteer opportunities and the organization's mission. After learning that some of the kids at Brent's Place do not have successful outcomes I decided that I was not at a point in my life where I could deal with loss. I came back to Brent's Place three years ago. After taking a tour of the Brent's Place facility I knew I was ready to get involved.

### *How do you contribute to the community at Brent's Place?*

For the past three years I have cooked meals for the families at Brent's Place once a month. I know that after a hectic day at the hospital there is one less thing the families at Brent's Place have to worry about because I prepared a meal for them



to eat. I used to volunteer cleaning the kids' toys and I chaperoned a few outings to museums and the zoo with the kids at Brent's Place.

In June of 2009 I approached Sean, the Executive Director at Brent's Place, because I wanted to volunteer in a leadership role, give back to Brent's Place in a larger capacity, and make a deeper impact. Together, we developed the concept for the Executive Leadership Council, or ELC, a group of energetic and enthusiastic young professionals that take an active role in family programs and fundraising for Brent's Place.

### *What about Brent's Place appeals to you as a volunteer?*

I really think that I get more out of volunteering compared to what I provide. I love interacting with the kids staying at Brent's Place and hearing the story of their journey from their parents. I like that I contribute to families that are away from their home and often separated from their loved ones. I get to create a sense of togetherness by providing a meal or chaperoning an outing.
